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## Section I. Overview

The following appendix is intended to be a reference guide for DVR customers and DVR staff on the spending guidelines for any particular service. All DVR spending guidelines are considered guidance. When reviewing the guidelines, it is recommended VR staff and customers remember:

- The spending guidelines are not absolute minimums or maximums. All VR services are based on the individualized needs of the customer, the specific employment goal of the customer and what other resources are available to the customer. DVR may pay more or less than the guideline depending on the individual circumstance. In some cases DVR will not contribute any funds to a service if the customer has access to other resources or comparable benefits to pay for a service.
- DVR customers and staff should reference the specific policy manual chapter to find out under what circumstances DVR will pay for a service. Except under extraordinary circumstances, DVR will only pay for services if those services will lead towards the eventual achievement of an employment goal. The specific policy chapter will also provide information regarding under what circumstances DVR will make exceptions from the spending guidelines.

## Section II Spending Guidelines

Unless otherwise indicated the following spending guidelines are for the duration of an open case.

Attendant Care	Prevailing rates as set by the Vermont Department of Disabilities, Aging and Independent Living (DAIL)
ASL Interpreters	Prevailing rate as set by DVR AA-16 blanket contract for certified interpreters
Foreign Language Interpreters	Prevailing rate as set by the Vermont Agency of Human Services blanket contract for foreign language interpretation. Go to <a href="http://intra.ahs.state.vt.us/centralsupport/lep/">http://intra.ahs.state.vt.us/centralsupport/lep/</a>
Note Taking	Prevailing state minimum wage
Tutor Services	\$12 to \$15 per hour
Employment Training Specialist	Prevailing rate as set by DVR AA-16 blanket contract for Employment Training Specialists
Driver	Minimum wage plus meals and mileage at the prevailing rate for Vermont state employees.

**311: Training**

<b>Service</b>	<b>Spending Guideline</b>
Full time Post Secondary Education	\$600 per semester
Part time Post Secondary Education	\$300 per semester
Non degree Post Secondary Classes	Up to two classes up to the maximum cost of a comparable class at the University of Vermont
Computer hardware and software as an accommodation for a disability	\$2,000
On the Job Training Funds	\$3,000

**312: Transportation**

<b>Service</b>	<b>Spending Guideline</b>
Vehicle (car) Purchase	\$3,000 for individuals who are job ready. \$2,000 for individuals who are not job ready
Van Purchase	\$3,000
Vehicle modification (van or car)	\$1,500 for individuals who are job ready \$1,000 for individuals who are not job ready
Van purchase if DVR is also supporting the van modifications	\$15,000 for first van \$12,000 for subsequent vans purchased for the same individual. 100% of required modifications identified by a certified Driver Rehabilitation Specialist
Vehicle repairs	\$1,000

**313: Audiology Services and Hearing Aids**

<b>Service</b>	<b>Spending Guideline</b>
All costs associated with the purchase of one hearing aid for a VR customer.	\$750 for one hearing aid \$1,000 for two hearing aids
